Position Title: Doctor of Occupational Therapy Faculty, Research Expert

Position Location: Wingate Main Campus

The Department of Occupational Therapy at Wingate University is excited to announce the opportunity to serve as a faculty member for the new entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program that began in August 2019. We invite applications for a 12-month, open rank faculty position with emphasis on the **research** curriculum. Faculty will develop and teach courses within the OTD curriculum, serve as a mentor for student research and doctoral capstone projects, advise students, and assist with ACOTE accreditation as a full member of the faculty team.

Qualified applicants will:

- Have earned an entry-level occupational therapy degree and must possess an earned doctorate in occupational therapy or a related area (OTD, PhD, EdD, DSc, etc.) from an accredited institution.
- Be licensed (or eligible for licensure) as an occupational therapist in North Carolina.
- Have a minimum of 5 years of clinical practice as an occupational therapist.
- Have a minimum of 1 year of teaching experience (preferred).
- Show expertise in developing, conducting, and overseeing research and/or doctoral capstone projects.
- Demonstrate excellent organizational and communication (written and oral) skills, and a commitment to student success.
- Display initiative and a desire for professional learning and growth.
- Show excellent problem solving, critical thinking, time management, and leadership skills.
- Show integrity, strong ethics, a heart for service, and respect for others.
- Be willing to travel to experiential sites, seminars, and conferences.
- Possess knowledge and skills associated with standard office software (Microsoft Word, Excel, etc.)

The entry-level Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) program is currently in Pre-accreditation Status with ACOTE and will be eligible for Full Accreditation Status in the Fall of 2021.
