Direct Admits	
Objective	Admit a select cohort of freshmen directly into the nursing program. Essentially direct admit will save student's place in the program for entry in their junior year, pending successful completion of required criteria during the first two years (freshman and sophomore) of prerequisite courses. *Refer to Application Requirements for criteria explanation.

Qualifications Must meet 2 of the 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High School Weighted GPA 3.8 • High School Unweighted GPA 3.0 • SAT 1100; ACT 23* <p>*Direct Admit applicants submitting standardized test scores who meet these minimums will not have to take the TEAS nursing admission test. Direct Admit applicants who either do not meet the minimum scores or do not submit standardized testing scores to the admissions department will have to meet the TEAS test score requirement of 68.</p>
Process	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Admissions will forward a report of applicants, selecting nursing as their major, who meet 2 of the 3 requirements to the nursing program director. • The nursing department will decide how many and which students will be offered direct admission. This decision will be based on science units taken in high school, which science units were taken, and consideration of weighted and unweighted GPAs in light of courses taken during high school, among other qualifications upon review. • The nursing department director will communicate direct admission offers to the office of admissions. • The student applicant must communicate their acceptance or declination of the admission by the deadline set by nursing and admissions.

<p>CNA-1 course Proof of completion of CNA-1 course in NC or state of student's residence within two (2) years of entering the nursing program or activity on the CNA registry when starting nursing classes.</p> <p>Students are not required to stay on the registry once enrolled in nursing but students actively on the registry who successfully complete NURS310 can apply for CNA-2 (Nurse Aide II) and be eligible for internships.</p> <p>If a CNA-1 course was completed during high school and the student was active on the registry but has let it expire, the student must get written approval from Dr. Barbee to be exempt from re-taking a CNA course at this time.</p>	August 2023

ATI ATI is a program that provides an all-inclusive package for student success, both in the program and passing NCLEX-RN. The program consists of tutorials, case studies, individual and group exercises; and subject assessments with remediation. NCLEX-RN review occurs during the last semester of the program. Continued Progression Through the Program

All nursing courses final grade of "C" (80) or higher

Clinical courses require *satisfactory/pass* on clinical evaluation

Re-Entry into Program

Students unsuccessful in meeting the progression requirements *during the first semester* can re-apply to the program with the current application pool by submitting an application due May 1.

Students unsuccessful in meeting the progression requirements *after completing the first semester* can request to re-enter the program by successfully passing a content competency examination based on the content of courses already successfully passed and passing a skills competency exam.

Re-applying and re-entry students are not guaranteed acceptance and they must meet all application and/or re-entry requirements.
