Graduate Ceremony COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Dr. Charlesa Hann serves as Interim Dean of the Thayer School of Education and Director of the Adult Bachelor's Degree Program at Wingate University. As Interim Dean of the School of Education, Dr. Hann oversees all teacher education licensure, non-licensure educational programs, and administrator licensure and leadership programs at the undergraduate, master's, and doctoral levels. The School of Education also houses the Adult Bachelor's Degree

program for those working adults who have credits from another institution and want to complete their bachelor's degree at Wingate.

Dr. Hann has presented and published research regarding adult learners and their unique learning and social needs, the impact of race on self-esteem and social interactions, diversity training, and the use of distance education and technology in the classroom. Her current research interests include transformational learning, transformational leadership,

best practices for building supportive cultures, and addressing inequities in education. She believes that access to opportunities and open dialogue among stakeholders are keys to promoting morale, equity, and inclusion for all.

Dr. Hann is passionate about mentoring others. She has worked with children and adults with special needs to help them realize their potential. She spent several years working with women with addictions, guiding them toward healing and rebuilding relationships.

Among her most significant achievements have been helping children, families, and service providers understand and address the impacts of race on social-emotional health and behavior, and mentoring adult professional students who are juggling multiple roles while completing adult and graduate programs. Dr. Hann completed all three of her degrees as a mother and working professional and understands the challenges of multiple role demands. She has received several Wingate University Mentor Medallions for her service to students.

Dr. Hann is a native of Akron, Ohio, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work from the University of Akron, a Master of Social Science Administration from Case Western Reserve University, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Public Affairs and Urban Studies from the University of Akron. After teaching at the collegiate level for 11 years in Ohio, Dr. Hann moved to North Carolina, where she taught high school special education for several years before returning to higher education at Wingate University in 2011. Dr. Hann has more than 25 years of experience as an advocate and educator.

Dr. Alison Brown is a Professor of Biology at Wingate University, where she serves as a teacher, research mentor, and academic advisor.

An East Tennessee native, Dr. Brown always planned to become a veterinarian and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Animal Science/Pre-Vet, with a minor in Biology, from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. However, a class in Reproductive Endocrinology at UT and later a discussion

with her high-school Biology teacher convinced her she was meant for a different path. She went on to receive a Master of Science in Curriculum and Instruction and a Master's in Reproductive Physiology from UT and a Ph.D. in Reproductive Physiology from West Virginia University.

Dr. Brown is in her 19th year as a faculty member at Wingate

University and teaches courses in Human Anatomy and Physiology, Reproductive Physiology, and Histology. During her tenure as department chair, she oversaw tremendous growth in the department of Biology as a result of the addition of multiple professional health science graduate programs at Wingate. Dr. Brown assisted in the development of the North Carolina GlaxoSmithKline Foundation Women in Science Scholars Program and the articulation agreement with the Edward Via College of Osteopathic Medicine (VCOM) and currently serves as the faculty liaison between Wingate University and VCOM.

She continues to study Reproductive Physiology in domestic animals and to mentor undergraduate students while collaborating with the United States Department of Agriculture U.S. Sheep Experiment Station and animal scientists across the United States. Dr. Brown has publications in peer-reviewed scientific journals and has served as an external reviewer for other universities on teaching, research, and service.

Dr. Brown has been recognized as a STEM professional role model for young women and was the recipient of the Wingate University Spivey Research Instructionship Award. She has served as a faculty-in-residence at Wingate and led W'International groups to Ireland and Denmark. Dr. Brown has received the Unsung Hero Award and been named Wingate University's Outstanding Advisor of the Year, and Phi Eta Sigma Honors Society Faculty of the Year. She has also been named to Who's Who Among American Teachers. Dr. Brown was this year's recipient of the Charles and Hazel Corts Award for Excellence in Teaching.

Dr. Brown enjoys traveling and spending time with her family and friends. She is an avid college sports fan, participates in a number of outdoor activities, cherishes her time at the gym, and delights in a good meal.

ACADEMIC HONORS & AWARDS

Wingate University recognizes undergraduate students with academic honors by bestowing upon them a gold-tasseled braid to be worn over the gown. These recognize three levels of **Latin honors**:

cum laude	magna cum laude	summa cum laude
with praise	with great praise	with highest praise
3.50-3.649	3.65-3.899	3.90-4.00

Undergraduate students with **University honors** are those students who successfully complete 17 hours of honors-designated courses. Wingate University recognizes these students by bestowing upon them a white-tasseled braid to be worn over the gown.

The Doctor of Pharmacy and Physical Therapy programs at Wingate University recognize their academic honor students by bestowing upon them a gold-tasseled braid with the following **Latin honors**:

cum laude	magna cum laude	summa cum laude

The **Pi Alpha Honor Society** is a national society that recognizes significant academic achievement, leadership, research, community/professional service, and the encouragement of a high standard of character and conduct among physician assistant (PA) students and graduates. These students are recognized by a turquoise- and graytasseled braid.

Wingate University recognizes students known to have served in the **United States Armed Forces** by bestowing upon them a red-, white- and blue-tasseled braid to be worn over the gown.

The **H.K. Helms Award** is presented annually to the undergraduates who have achieved the highest academic average. The award honors the memory of former Wingate Mayor and businessman H.K. Helms, who also served as chair of the Wingate University Board of Trustees.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The formal academic dress worn today originated more than 600 years ago, apparently at Oxford and Cambridge. First a practical concession to the comfort of scholars and clerics laboring in unheated stone buildings, the apparel has changed little in appearance but has taken on a significant role in identifying the degree and alma mater of its wearer.

Gowns indicate bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees. Bachelor's gowns are traditional black and are unadorned. Master's gowns have an elongated oval sleeve. The gowns of those holding doctoral degrees are distinguished by the velvet panels on the front and the velvet bands on the sleeves. The president is the only academic entitled to wear the fourth band on the sleeve.

Hoods indicate the colors of the institution from which the degree was received, and the color of the hood's border represents the academic discipline in which the degree was earned. For example: white, arts and letters; scarlet, theology; dark blue, philosophy; yellow, science; pink, music; light brown, business; light blue, education; copper, economics; green, medicine; olive green, pharmacy; sage green, physical education.

Mortarboards of those with bachelor's and master's degrees carry black tassels. The gold tassel is reserved for holders of doctoral degrees.

ACADEMIC PROCESSIONAL

The academic processional is organized according to academic office and rank, in the following order: faculty marshal (mace bearer), officers of the University, professors, associate professors, assistant professors, and instructors. At any point during the processional or recessional, audience members are requested to stand.

WINGATE UNIVERSITY MACE

Maces have been used in legal and religious settings for centuries. Originally used as defensive weapons, maces have their roots in Roman courts, where they were used to restore order and mete out punishment. They were initially carried in the 12th century Roman Catholic Church to protect bishops, cardinals, and the pope and were clubshaped because priests were forbidden from shedding blood. Maces eventually came to be regarded as symbols of authority. In a University setting, this implies the authority to grant degrees and marks significant occasions on the academic calendar.

The Wingate University mace is made of solid dark walnut with two bronze University seals and is 42 inches in length. The University seal features oak leaves (representing the oak trees that populate the Academic Quad) and the Latin phrase "Fides, Scientia, Pietas," which roughly translates as "Faith, Knowledge, Service" - the University motto. The mace should always lead the ceremony and procession.






