

Reverse Transfer at Wingate University

Reverse transfer is the process by which **transfer** students enrolled at a four-year institution **transfer** credits back to a community college for the purpose of attaining a degree, diploma or certification from the community college.

Wingate University transfer students may indicate their interest in reverse transfer by completing a Reverse Transfer Transcript Release Form in order to have their university transcript sent back to their community college. The community college will evaluate the coursework to determine if degree, diploma or certification requirements are met and if a degree or other credential will be awarded by the community college. Any community-college degree or other credential will be awarded in the semester or year all final requirements are met at the community college.

Students interested in this opportunity should complete the <u>Reverse Transfer Transcript Release Form</u>. They should be working with their advisors at Wingate and the North Carolina Community College to ensure all degree requirements are met.

To be eligible to participate in a reverse transfer program, students must have completed at least 25% of the course of study in residency at the North Carolina Community College (most often at least 15 credit hours). They must earn grades of C or better in all classes transferred from Wingate to the North Carolina Community College for purposes of attaining the degree. They must earn a minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher at both the community college and Wingate.
